TURNER'S POSSIBILITIES

Last week we gave a short review of the advancements that had taken place in Turner during the past three years. This week we wish to place before the citizens some of the possibilities of our city and community. We have buildings already located in Turner that have been used as packing plants for fruit and flax scutching but are now standing idle. A cannery should be in operation in this building using up the farmer's product in the way of fruit and vegetables. A cannery in Turner would stimulate the raising of fruit and vegetables such as beans, cabbage, squashes, pumpkins and others suitable for canning. Farmers who are raising this produce are now compelled to haul it to Salem. We also have a flax scutching plant that operated last year but has been idle this year. Why is it not in operation? Operation of these and other kinds of enterprises are vital to the growth of our city. We have a flour mill that turns out a product equal to any of the market. The time is coming when this mill will be operated full time with flour and feed grinding and the mixing of all kinds of stock food. We have water power going to waste that would operate a good sized manufacturing plant. Turner has excellent railroad facilities, being located on the main line of the Southern Pacific with plenty of trackage. With the water power and direct connection to one of the trunk lines of the Portland Electric Power Co., we have a cheap power for manufacturing purposes. Turner also has some desirable building sites either on the highlands or the clear water of Mill Creek. The time will come when the people of Turner will see factories in operation and the vacant lots covered with homes. We have one of the best gravity water systems for fire protection of any town of its size in Oregon. This soil in Turner is particularly adapted to the raising of flowers and vegetable gardens. With all these possibilities, why is Turner still behind other cities of its size in Oregon. Let us all work for a "Greater Turner."

Football season is on. Turner is preparing to enter the grand rush. The coach of the high school is drilling a squad of huskies that will soon be able to take on all comers and give them a hard tussel. When our high school team gets whipped into line we predict victories for them. Turner has had the champion basketball and base ball teams. Why not football?
