Charles Brasher is placing a cement walk in front of his residence property in Turner.

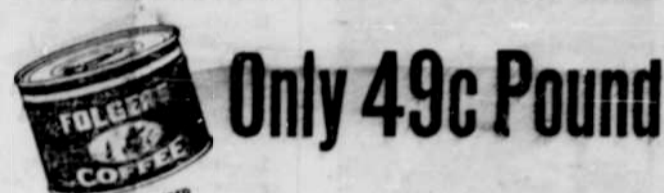
Fred Mitchell and Robert Schaefer returned Monday from a few days hunting trip in Southern Oregon.

MYSTERY SPRING IS DEVELOPING QUICKLY

F. A. Robertson, proprietor of the Sheridan Mystery Springs, is spending several days in Turner and reports that the development work on the Sheridan Mystery Springs is progressing nicely. The entire building is heated by flash plate boilers. The steam for the baths is generated by a spray of mineral water in a five foot steam dome falling on hot boulders. This gives immediate steam at 280 degrees of heat in 12 minutes from time the fire is started.

Mud, tub, steam and shower baths are installed already. Many of the people of Sheridan and surrounding territory have tested out to their satisfaction the curative properties of the baths. Owing to the building not being all completed before the bad weather the baths are temporarily closed except on application.

A large deposit of fine textured mineral clay has been discovered on the property which makes a fine beauty clay and is also beneficial for clearing up the skin and curing skin diseases.
