SPEEDY JUSTICE

The state of Michigan has set the mark for speedy justice in the sentencing of Adolph Hotelling for the brutal murder of Dorothy Schneider. He confessed to the murder and was immediately sentenced to life imprisonment. Contrast this with the Hickman trial, in Los Angeles—Hickman confessed to the murder and is still unsentenced. He pleaded insanity at the request of his attorney, and is now trying to prove that there was insanity in the family. There is too much leniency of the court along this line. Most of them get insane after the crime is committed and they are caught, and make this their plea to escape justice. But, in the Michigan courts, Hotelling's sentence followed almost immediately after his confession. If more of the courts would take this plan of action there would be fewer crimes committed and the taxpayers would get off with less expense.
