NOTICE DOG OWNERS
Under the present law all dogs 8 months old or over must be licensed, and this law reads: On March 1st a penalty of \$1 will be added on all male and spayed female dog licenses unpaid, making them \$2 on March 1st, and a penalty of \$2 will be added on all female dog licenses unpaid making them \$4 on March 1st. The law applies to the keeper of dogs as well as owner.
