REGISTER NOW

You MUST be registered before you can vote. No one can be sworn in on election day. ALL voters must be registered 30 days before any election. This is the law that went into effect last June.

Registration closes April 17th. A voter who is now registered and moved out of his precinct, or wishes to change his politics, or a woman who has married must re-register. If you are registered, and voted once in the two years last passed and have not moved you need not register.

To register call at the County Clerk's office or on H. L. Earl, Turner; E. T. Pierce, Aumsville; Robert E. Larsen, Shaw; M. A. Barber, Marion; T. Y. McClellan, West Stayton; H. D. Mars, Jefferson. They are the local Registrars and any of the above named will register you free of charge. Do it now and be able to vote on Election Day.
