I. N. COOK BURIED TUESDAY AFTERNOON

I. N. Cook, prominent farmer of Marion, died Friday night, after an illness of nine weeks. He was 76 years old. Mr. Cook was born on the old Cook donation land claim, near Turner in 1862. He was the son of Francens Marion Cook, who crossed the plains and settled in Marion county in 1845.

I. N. Cook, at the time of his death, owned part of the original donation land claim, which was divided up a few years year ago. At the time of his death he owned three farms, the 60-acre home place, 120 acres of the original claim and 60 acres of what was known as the Dave Edgar place.

He is survived by two children, Hugh Cook and Ruth Cook Gentry. Two brothers, Frank Cook of Turner and Tom Cook of Helix. Two sisters, Mrs. Nellie Miller and Mrs. Sudie Neal.

Funeral services were held from the Presbyterian church at Marion. Commitment services were in the Twin Oak cemetery at Turner, Tuesday afternoon.

H. A. KEENE PASSES AT HOME TUESDAY

H. A. Keene, 63, well known in Salem and Marion county, where he has resided for the past 58 years, died at the family residence at 7 o'clock Tuesday morning, after a two weeks illness with pneumonia.

Keene came with his parents and their family to Salem from

Minnesota in 1870, moving that same year to a farm in the Waldo Hills. There Keene resided until 1923, when he retired from active farm life, placing his interests in the hands of his son, Lloyd. He purchased the home place at the death of his father. In 1923 Mr. and Mrs. Keene took up their residence at the State street address in Salem.

On May 8, 1889, Keene was married to Eva Howd of Shaw, who survives.

Keene was prominently identified as a member of the First Christian church of Salem, and in the Odd Fellows, Elks and Modern Woodmen lodges.

Surviving relatives besides the widow and only son, include two sons, R. G. Keene of Los Angeles and A. A. Keene of Salem; three sisters, Mrs. W. C. U'Ren of Spokane, Mrs. H. J. Downing of Marcola, Ore., and Mrs. H. E. Smith of Portland, and a granddaughter, Geraldine Mae Keene of Salem.

Funeral services will be held from Rigdon mortuary Thursday afternoon at 1 o'clock, with Rev. D. J. Howe, pastor, of the First Christian church, officiating. Interment will be in Twin Oaks cemetery at Turner.—Capital Journal.
