Filing of the referendum petition against the excise tax bill passed at the last session of the legislature was refused by the secretary of state for two reasons. One was that the petitions arrived after the time limit had expired and the other was that there was not enough names contained therein. These petitions were brought to Salem by a prominent Portland attorney and two companions who violated the law in presenting these petitions in order to nullify a law passed by the Oregon legislature. It is reported in the press that they are under investigation by the state traffic department when it was reported that Wood and his companions drove from Portland to Salem, a distance of 52 miles in one hour and three minutes, or nearly fifty miles an hour. They violated one law in attempting to do away with another. By all means this should be investigated. If it is so they should be prosecuted under the state traffic laws which fixes the speed limit at 25 to 35 miles per hour and 20 miles per hour through the corporate limits of cities and towns. This is supposed to be a country with equal rights for all. Why not enforce the law equally on all alike and not allow a privileged class to get by with a speed of fifty miles an hour and arrest some one else for driving one or two miles over the speed limit.

Who Is The Hog?

The Albany Democrat Herald in strong language condemns Salem and Marion county interests for doing the same thing Albany and Linn county is doing, and that is working for the Santiam Highway. Albany threatens through her spokesman, the Democrat-Herald, to use force to bring Salem and Marion county to her knees in deep repentance before Alcany. If Albany thinks Salem and Marion county will listen to arguments of this kind she has several more thoughts coming. Marion County has no desire to work a hardship on any other community in the matter of the Santiam highway. The Marion county court and the highway commission in conjunction with the forest service decided on the Detroit route on account of the reduced cost of construction by the fact that there is several miles of old railroad grade that can be used. This fact coupled with the benefits derived by the road being already graded and gravelled to Detroit and the grade completed several miles beyond Detroit gives added features to bring the road over the north route. Salem and Marion county are not trying to arbitrarily steal the road from Albany. The fact of the matter is Salem has no organization that is working definitely for either road. The work has really been done by the county court and highway commission. Salem would be satisfied if the north route were used the only limitation would be that the road went over Hog Pass, thereby having a pass open the year around. Albany is seeing gohols in the matter of Salem playing hog in the road question. The only hog that is insisted on is "Hog Pass."

When Things Start to Drop

American courts are getting around to decisions concerning air travel and some interesting points are coming up. In New Jersey a parachutist has been arrested for trespass at the request of a farmer on whose land he landed.

The case seems likely to go up through higher courts, with parachutist insisting that his place of landing was an act of God and the farmer equally insistent that chute jumpers choose some other place besides his fields on which to alight.

The case is in the courts and we shall not comment on it one way or another. But we foresee a great mass of litigation when careless aerial tourists start tossing overboard empty ginger ale bottles and the like and the house holders awaken to find a hole through the roof and a monkey wrench reposing in a dent in the hardwood floor of the living room — Portland Daily News.
