1-1-1-1-1-1 "Dog Days"

DOG days is a name which has been banged down to us by the ancients as designating that season-which has the reputation of being the hottest and most unwholesome period of the year. This condition was supposed to be influenced by one or the other or both of the dog stars-Sirius, the greater, and Procyon, the lesser-it being the popular belief that during this time dogs are apt to run mad, hence the term "dog" naturally fastened itself to these days. History tells us that in early times

dog days were estimated as forty in number-twenty before and twenty after the rising of the dog star. As a matter of fact, the duration of this period appears to have varied from as little as thirty to as much as fiftyfour days, beginning anywhere from July 3 to August 15. The co-inci-dental appearance of the dog star and these so-called dog days appears to have been accidental, as the time of the rising of this star varies with the altitude. In some climates there are no dog days, for the reason that in certain aititudes the dog star is not visible, hence there can be no dog

In ancient times it seems apparent that the dog star rose just before the sun. Its time of rising appears to gradually grow inter as the years pass by, owing, no doubt, to the gradual repression of the equinoxial period, consequently, in future centuries, it may come to pass that the dog star will rise during the winter



Will Never Be Fired Again Unless in Warfare









Sulphur Found in Craters Sulphur is being spouted by volcanoes of Chile, according to Don Juan M. Golkovic, a Montenegrin prospector, who claims to have found the richest deposit of pure sulphur in the world. Estimates have placed the quantity found at more than 2,000,000 tons. It is lodged in the slopes of six volcanoes. From the mouths of the craters. about 95 per cent pure sulphur continues to flow, according to the explorer. The find is the result of 30 years of exploration by Golkovic.
