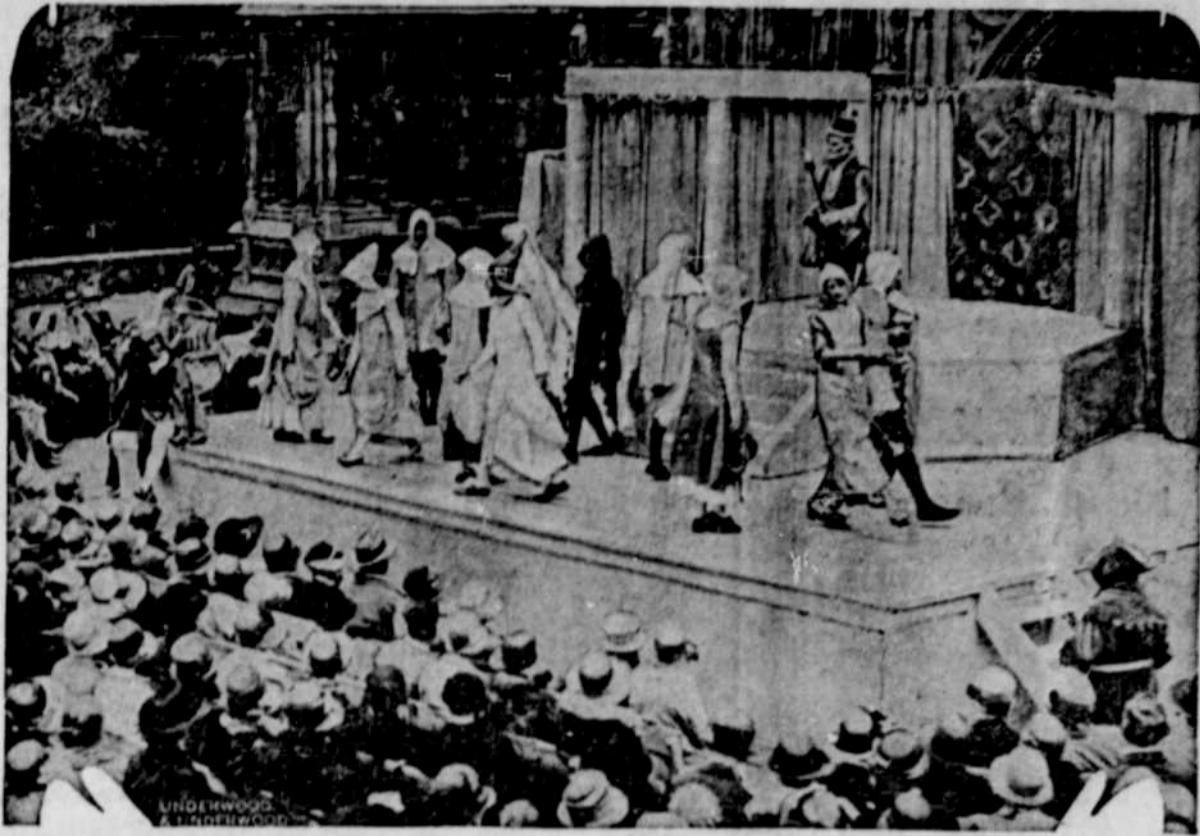

The Welland Ship Canal

A WELLAND canal has afforded a passageway between Lakes Erie and Ontario for well nigh a hundred years.

The original Welland was first sailed in 1828. It was 27 1/2 miles long, 22 feet wide, 8 feet deep, and contained 40 locks, each 110 feet long. It was enlarged, rebuilt and again placed in service in 1845.

Some conception of the magnitude of the work of constructing the new ship canal can be gained from the fact that some 6,000,000 wagon-loads of rock and 40,000,000 wagon-loads of earth had to be excavated.

The time required to pass a loaded vessel through the completed canal will approximate 8 hours, as against 15 to 18 hours with the present canal.

The cost of the completed job will approach \$100,000,000.

The Los Angeles Aqueduct

THE Los Angeles aqueduct is "as long as England is wide. It goes under mountains, through 142 tunnels and crosses a desert as large as the state of Massachusetts."

The constant movement of such a great quantity of water presented a too-good-to-be-true opportunity for the development of large quantities of cheap electric power.

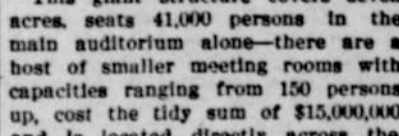

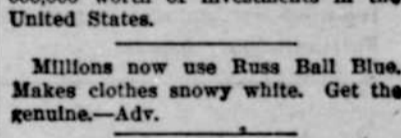

It must have been the village idiot who invented the adage, "Don't judge others by yourself." One self is the only person on earth by whom one can possibly judge others.—American Magazine.

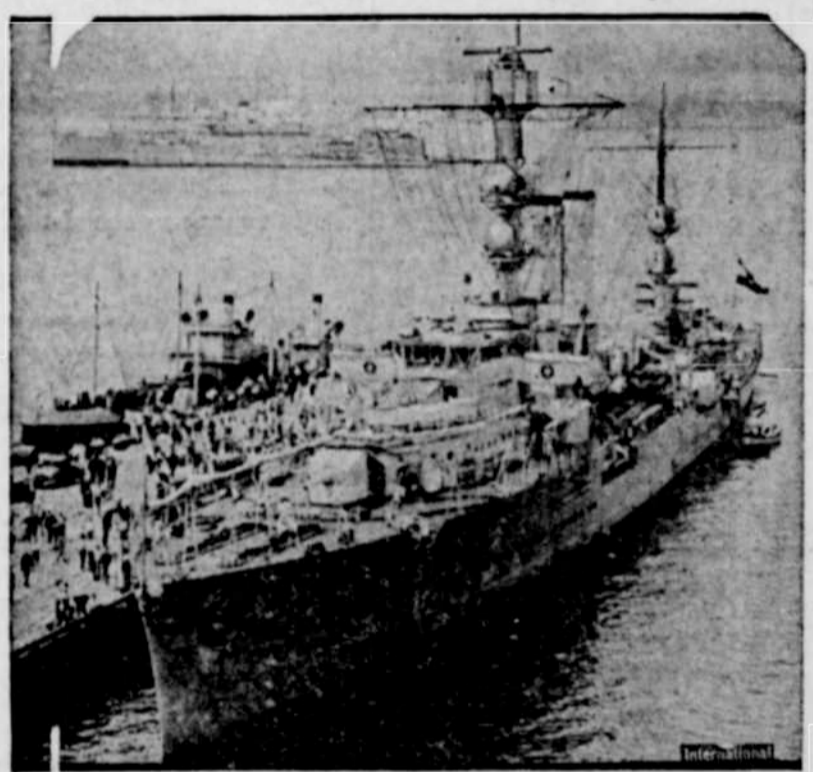
