In an attempt to cope with the prob able traffic demands of future generations, man has dared to build a bridge of such gigantic proportions as to stag-ger the imagination. The bridge prop er will jump the river in a single span 3,500 feet long, while its length, exclusive of the ornate plazas which are planned for either end, will be 7,800 feet. Its two plers, resting on bed rock, will each be 210 by 65 feet at base and tower 635 feet above the water and its floor, which will be 253 feet above the water, will have ar ultimate width of 188 feet. The weight of the suspended construction will approximate 90,000 tons, supported by cables containing 26,474 wires each and three feet thick.

The design adopted admits of expanding the capacity as necessity demands. Originally, its one deck will carry four lanes of vehicular traffic and two sidewalks. Later, two 24 foot roadways can be added. Finally a second deck can be swung under the first one, providing for from two to eight tracks for rapid transit service bringing the maximum capacity of the structure up to something like 30,000. 000 vehicles annually. All told, this is one of the most difficult construction feats yet attempted by man,

The Moffat Tunnel

A FTER years of tedlous boring through six miles of solld rock and the expenditure of about \$18,000, 000-the Moffat tunnel, carrying twin steel ralls through the backbone of this continent, fifty miles northwest




