**MAKING IMPROVEMENTS**

The Southern Pacific company have been busy the past few weeks making improvements to their property in Turner. The grading is completed and track laying is now in progress on the two thousand foot extension to the south end of the passing track.

The caterpillar tractor has been working the past few days filling in the old power ditch from the mill ditch to the old Albers Brothers' warehouse, that is being torn down by Charles Martin, of Aumsville. While attempting to cross the ditch the caterpillar mired down in the soft mud and for two or three days baffled all attempts at removal, until H. R. Peetz hooked onto it with an insignificant little stump puller

and dislodged it from its muddy bed. The old ditch is being filled in and levelled off, which will add to the appearance of the railroad property. It has been rumored that some kind of a factory building will be erected on the site.
