A Step in the Right Direction

A report of the Oregon Judicial Council, signed by Justices Belt and Coshow, of the state supreme court, and Circuit Judges Alger Fee of Pendleton, Robert Tucker of Portland and James Brand of Marshfield, filed with Governor Norblad, Saturday, contains a number of recommendations which it is felt by the

council would expedite and improve existing court procedure.

Probably the most important of these recommendations is the one providing that a person convicted of crime on a plea of insanity shall be sentenced to serve at least three years in Maud Mishler the following described an intene asylum without right of habeas corpus.

Any number of cases might be cited showing flagrant abuse of the insanity defense, where the defendant has been adjudged insane and after a brief confinement in a hospital has been released. It is this sort of thing that is responsible for much of the current criticism that our criminal laws are inefficient and unfairly administered.

The council is to be congratulated for its stand on this question and immediate steps toward the adoption of its recommendation should be taken.
