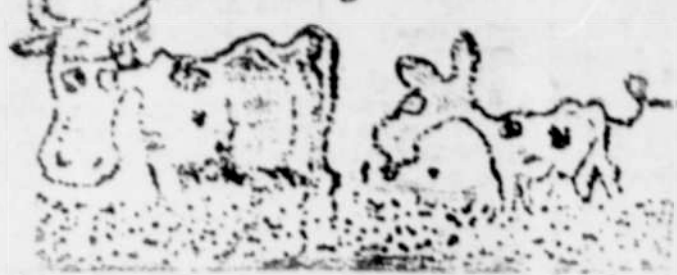


One Ting After An Udder

Now that the new cannery is practically assured, we think the people ought to start preparing to plant pumpkins and beans, etc.

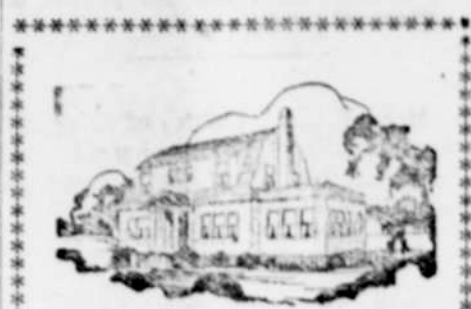
The city council might even plant a couple pumpkins at the two or three bad turns in town. That would inspire people to grow bigger and better ones.

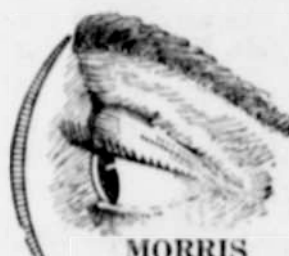
