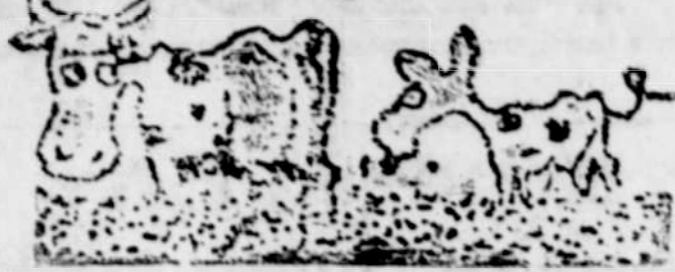


One 'Ting After An Udder
