Aumsville scored first in the third inning on four hits, a walk and an error, bringing in four runs. Stayton scored first in the fifth on a walk and two errors. A walk, a sacrifice and a hit scored another for Stayton in the sixth. Aumsville scored again in the seventh on two hits and Stayton scored again in the eighth on two walks and an error.
