Alfalfa Mill at Baker.

The Baker alfalfa mills last night completed a two-day test run during which almost 50 tons of alfalfa had been cut up into a fine grade of meal.

The mill is owned by J. M. Bowles and has just been completed at a cost of \$4500 for the machinery and \$1500 for the sheet iron building in which it and the hay are housed. It has a capacity of between 20 and 30 tons per day.

The machinery of the mill is of the very latest type and is made by the Fairbanks-Morse Co., this being the first mill of this type they have put out. The alfalfa is fed into the usual band cutter and carried through it into the mill proper where it is cut into shreds by the heavy corrugated rolls. It is then carried by means of a fan through a conduit to the loft of the mill and into a dusting machine where the dust is taken out and later, since it is the pulverization of the fine leaves of the plant that makes the dust, this is mixed with the coarser meal and sent down through a spout to a sacking machine. A motor of 100 horse power supplies power for the mill.

The grinding is most thorough and is largely due to the speed to which the mill is geared, the rolls making 2300 revolutions per minute.

Six men are employed when the mill is running, to feed it, and sack the product. A seventh, Mr. Bowles looks after the machinery.

The product will largely be used in Baker City and the surrounding towns, although some of it will be shipped out. It retails at \$1.00 per hundred, and owing to the chopped condition is said to be an admirable feed for horses, cattle, hogs, sheep, and chickens, supplying the need of green feed. In the form of meal it is claimed that the animals get much more nutriment than from the same bulk of hay.

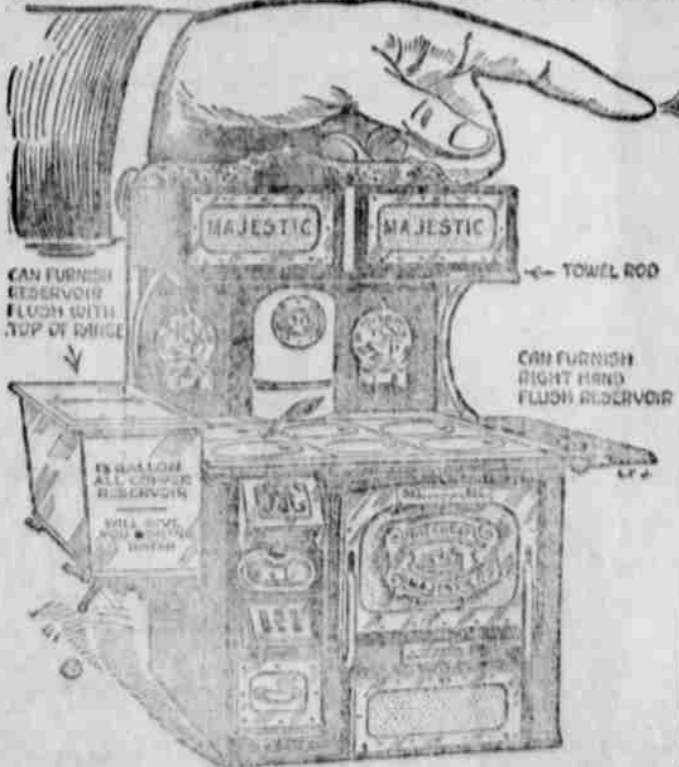
