It is estimated that the grand total for the state this year will be \$245-979,000, more than \$20,000,000 in excess of the returns of last year. The estimate of items is as follows: Live stock \$107,-914,000: grain, \$38,145,000 vegetables; \$22,135,000; fruit, \$8,143,000; miscellaneous, \$69, 642,000.

Three submarine divers sent to the State of California in Alaskan waters were able to descend only to the pinnacle of the rock on which the vessel struck. No further effort will be made to recover the 20 bodies supposed to lie in the cabin of the lost ship.

The palace of peace at The Hague was dedicated by Queen Wilhelmina in the presence of 2000 officials and delegates to the recent peace conference there. Andrew Carnegie received the grand cross of the Order of Orange-Nassau at the hands of the queen.

Precanceled stamps, the newest wrinkle adopted by the government to save time in the delivery of packages and incidentally save hundreds of thousands to the government, will soon be in use. The new scheme calls for the cancellation of stamps before they are sold and they will be used by the big stores and mail order houses who send out great quantities of mail each day.


