

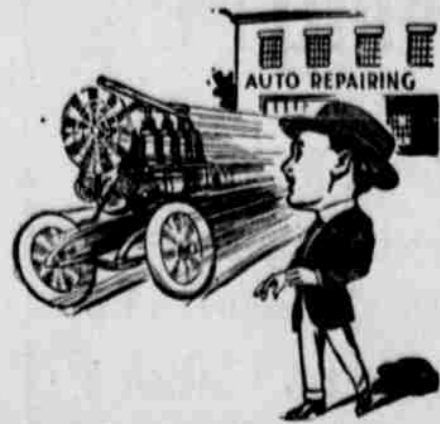

Mrs. L. Adam was a Boise visitor Tuesday of this week.



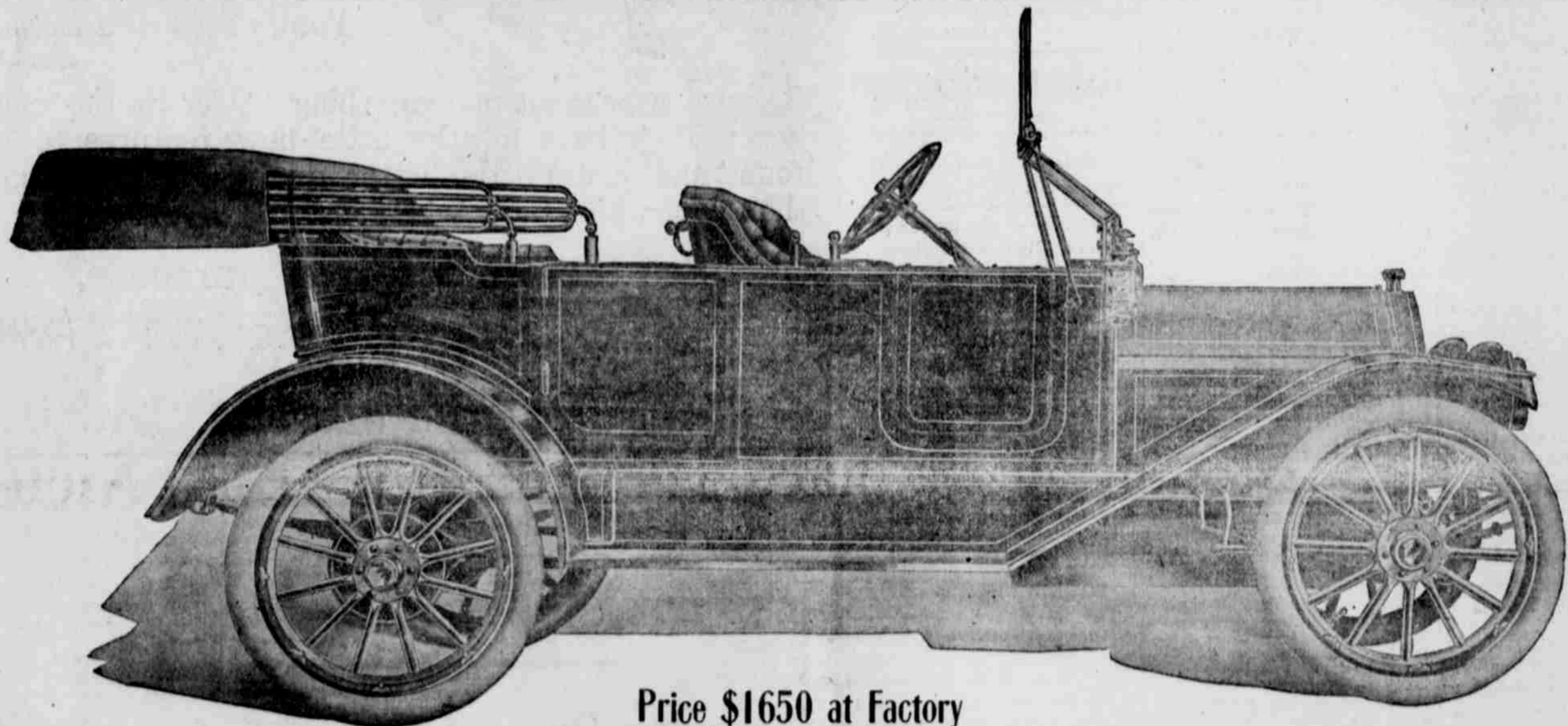
