Prof. and Mrs. T. R. Neilson are the proud parents of a fine baby boy born October 26.

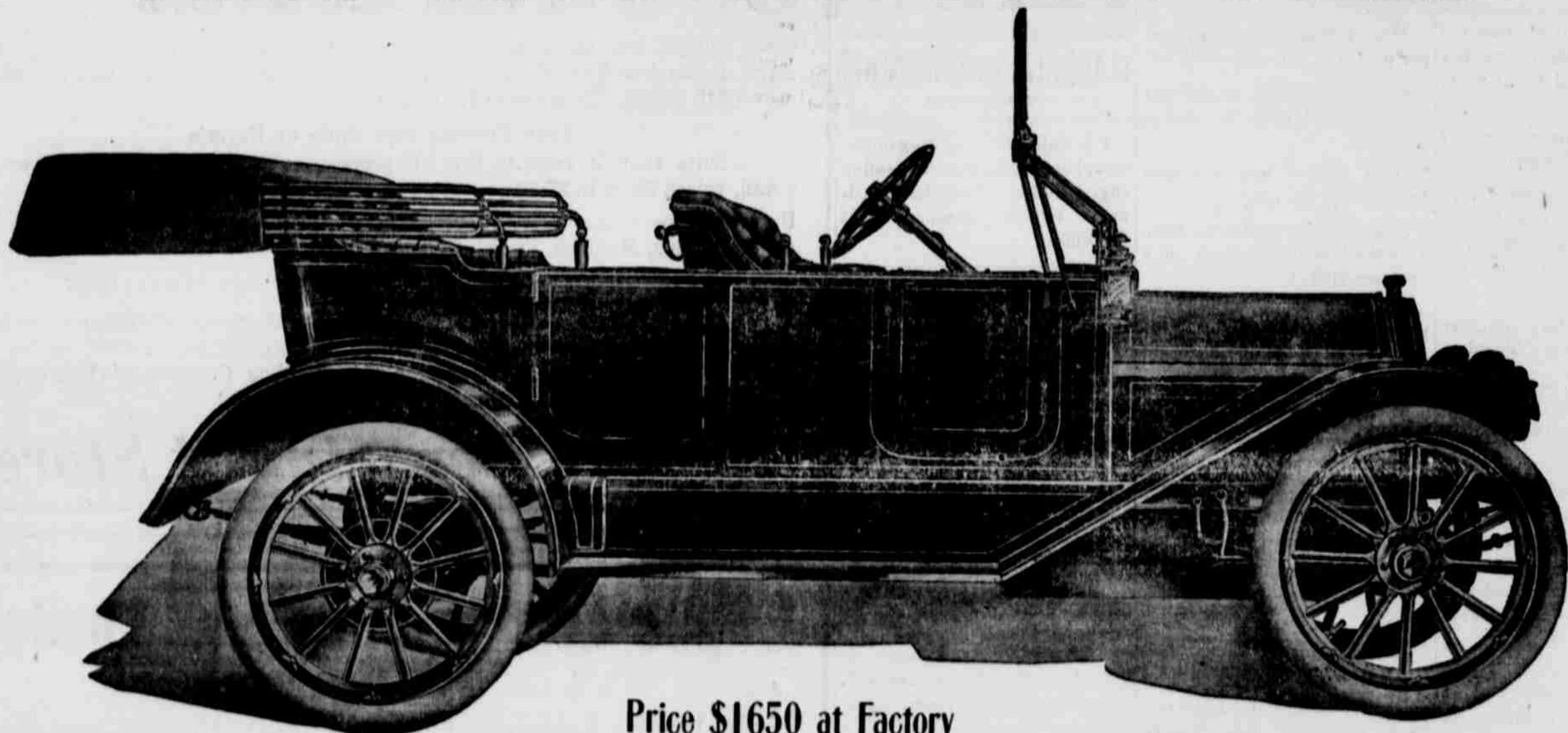
C. E. Harry and children returned the first of the week from Missouri where they have been visiting relatives.
