NEWS OF GENERAL INTEREST IN IDAHO

Important Occurrences Of The Past Week From Cities In Our State

Chautauqua is Assured.
Caldwell.—The feature of the week's development here is the successful conclusion of a campaign inaugurated to get together the necessary guarantee to insure the holding of a Chautauqua here in July. On account of the high cost it has heretofore been beyond the reach of the city.

A new co-operative Chautauqua plan, it is said, has made it possible to include in the circuit such towns as can raise a guarantee of from \$1500 to \$3000. Caldwell has succeeded in this effort, and the list of attractions will include the Spirella band, Dr. Green, Dwight Hillis, Chapin, Kramer and other entertainers.

Sandpoint To Advertise.
Sandpoint.—At the meeting of the commercial club the report of the committee which advised the raising of \$250 for advertising purposes was adopted. The money, which will be raised by assessing every member 50 cents per month for four months, will be used in publicity work through the medium of the local papers.

It is planned to get out special editions at various times during the year and have the club members work with the newspapers in making the editions possible. These editions will be sent to inquirers from other parts of the country in an endeavor to interest them in this vicinity.

Poison Testimony Given.
Boise.—That William Tracy, held by the police as a suspect and believed by them to have killed Fred Wallace and Thomas Brown by poisoned whiskey, did put a drug in the bottle, which he later asked a bartender to fill with whiskey, was the testimony given to the coroner's jury. Owing to the fact that the state chemist will be unable to complete his analysis of the stomach and liver taken from Brown's body until January 1, the jury took an adjournment to that date.

Money Assured for Project.
Weiser.—Ending nearly six months of anxiety on the part of settlers, contractors and others, came the announcement with the return from the east of A. H. Keller, cashier of the local bank, that ample finances are now assured for the completion of the Crane creek irrigation project, designed to deliver water on 125,000 acres of land next spring.

TAX CUT FOR BIG COMPANIES

The State Auditor Wants Shoshone Commissioners to Make Reduction Wallace.—Taxpayers of Shoshone county will be losers of \$779.21 in state taxes if the county officials comply with the request of State Auditor Huston. Kellogg will also lose. In a communication received from State Auditor Huston the county auditor is requested to reduce the valuation of the Washington Water Power company on the rolls from \$1,293,757 to \$1,019,229, the tax commission having recommended a valuation on the 99.87 miles of transmission line in Shoshone county of \$16,205 per mile, or a reduction of \$274,558 in its assessed valuation. Request is made as to the Postal Telegraph and Cable company, that its assessed valuation be reduced from \$6000 to \$1800 or a reduction of \$4200. The North Idaho Telephone company is now asked to be placed on the rolls at a valuation of \$56,096, as against an approximate valuation of \$22,000 for 1912 and making an aggregate reduction in the county's assessed valuation of \$222,632.

Idaho Drys Begin Work.
Caldwell.—State-wide prohibition for Idaho is the intention of the newly-organized state committee, which is beginning active work, with Harry Hays, of Caldwell, as chairman, and Jake Mussell, also of this place, as secretary. The committee has chosen A. A. Phelps, of Boise, as executive secretary and circulars have been sent out. Headquarters will be opened in Boise and an aggressive campaign will be started at once.

Prize-Winning Stallion Sold.
Lewiston.—Piccolo, a Belgian stallion who won the championship in that class at the Northwest Live Stock show, was sold by Brown & Moon of Moscow to Stevens Brothers of Tammany, the consideration being \$2500. The animal is 2 years old and weighs 1900 pounds.

Predicts Severe Winter.
Deary.—William Dillman, one of the oldest and most experienced trappers in Latah county, says that, judging from the coats being put on by the fur bearing animals of this vicinity, the winter will be severe.
