Washington .- The river and harbor bill, carrying one of the largest appropriations in recent years, will meet determined opposition in the senate this week

The bill on the face of it, as indorsed by the senate committee on commerce, carries about \$53,000,000. Acwill be much greater.

#### Would Limit Campaign Expenditures.

The bill limiting the use of the "barrel" provides for the control of campaign contributions and expenditures

It is a codification of the three existing federal laws with regards to campaign expenditures. It also contrains several new sections.

The most significant of these is the one which provides that no "political committee" may use in any state a greater amount than the aggregate contributed by the citizens of that state.
