BRIEF NEWS OF OREGON

Coyotes have been committing many depredations in Crook county.

Frank A. Hoffman, a pioneer of 1852, died at New Era, aged 90 years. The Columbia county teachers' institute will be held at St. Helens November 4, 5 and 6.

An automobile containing four persons was cut square in two by an O-W. R. & N. train at Telocaset and the occupants sustained only minor injuries.

By a vote of 245 to 40 teachers attending the Marion county institute at Salem rejected a proposition to substitute summer school work for the annual institute.

A petition to divide Grant county asks that seven of the northern precincts of Grant county be cut off to form a new county, to be named Wana, an Indian word, meaning running water, and used by the Indians to designate the north fork of the John Day river.
