#### WHO WILL GAIN POSSESSION OF THE EARTH?

To the Editor:  
The great war which is now raging in Europe, naturally raises the question of the future mastery of that portion of the world. Should there be a decisive outcome to the struggle, the victorious power would be in a position to dictate terms to Europe; and from the mastery of Europe it would be but a step to the position of world supremacy.

There exists however an impassable barrier in the pathway to this coveted goal of power. The Word of the Almighty has declared that there will never again be upon this earth a successor to imperial Rome. No conqueror will ever arise who will be able to bring the world to his feet. No nation will ever be able to bring all the other nations into subjection.

This is plainly stated in the prophecy of Daniel, chapter two, where, in explaining to the king of Babylon his dream concerning the great image, the prophet Daniel declared: "And whereas thou sawest the feet and toes, part of potter's clay and part of iron, the kingdom shall be divided; . . . And whereas thou sawest iron mixed with miry clay, they shall mingle themselves with the seed of men; but they shall not cleave one to another, even as iron is not mixed with clay."

Since the decline and fall of the iron monarchy of Rome, there have been repeated efforts to weld together into one solid mass the broken fragments of that empire. Clovis, Charlemagne, Charles V, and Napoleon Bonaparte, essayed to become rulers of the world; but none of them could cement the iron and clay of the prophetic image. They were striving against the fiat of heaven. As one writer has forcibly expressed it: "The earth reeled under the fierce charges of these world-empire grasping warriors, but the Word of the Lord stood fast, and Europe remained divided."

Nor has the effort to bind the nations together into one by marital alliances been any more successful. The royal families have intermarried very extensively, but the ties thus formed have accomplished nothing toward political union. King Geo. of England is cousin to the German Kaiser, and the Czar of Russia is a relative also. Yet this relationship does nothing to prevent war. In no instance has there been a cleaving together of the kingdoms through the marital "mingling" of which the prophet spoke.

Yet there is to be another and final universal kingdom, foreshadowed by the "stone" of this prophetic dream, which "smote the image upon his feet that were of iron and clay, and brake them to pieces." Dan. 2:34. For of this stone it was said by the prophet, that it "became a great mountain and filled the whole earth"; and in the explanation of this portion of the dream the prophet said: "In the days of these kings shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom, which shall never be destroyed; and the kingdom shall not be left to other people, but it shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms, and it shall stand forever." Dan. 2:35, 44.

We are living today at a time when all the events pointed out by inspired prophecy as marking the approach of that kingdom, are with but one or two exceptions, in the past. Almost the very sign of its coming was stated by the Saviour in the words: "This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come." Matt. 24:14. That this work has now almost been accomplished, every person knows who is acquainted with the extent of Christian missionary effort at the present time.

#### BIG PLANETS GLOW LIKE ARC LIGHTS

Hanging tandem like a couple of arc lights, Venus and Jupiter have been making a brilliant display in the western heavens and have attracted a great deal of attention. Yesterday morning at 3 o'clock they were in conjunction, and last night they were apparently only a short distance apart.

Venus is the one above, and while only 7630 miles in diameter, as against Jupiter's diameter of 86,000 miles, is much brighter because it is nearer the sun. Venus is a matter of 67,000,000 miles from the sun, to the 483,000,000 miles of Jupiter. On next Tuesday Jupiter will be in conjunction with the sun.

In addition to the spectacular appearance of Venus and Jupiter in the early evening, Saturn blazes in the Gemini constellation at 9 p. m. and Neptune is near the meridian at 10 p. m. Mars, which was 860,000,000 miles from the earth last Thursday, rises before sunset and can be found shortly after dark near Regulus, in Leo, near the handle of the "sickle." Later in the month Mercury can be seen an hour and a half before sunrise. At present Mercury is so near the sun that it is invisible.
