GRASSHOPPERS INVADE CLOVER

Twin Falls, Ida.—Lack of preparedness against an invasion of grasshoppers in southern Idaho will probably result in serious loss to farmers having clover fields. Every drug store in the county has orders filed for from 50 to 1000 pounds of sodium arsenate for spraying clover fields, but the supply is exhausted. One local store telegrapher leading wholesale houses in San Francisco, Los Angeles, Kansas City, St. Louis, Philadelphia and other large places but was unable to get even a pound of the powder. The greater part of the 7600 acres of red clover in this section is imperiled.

Not believing this country would ever be attacked by the 'hopper enemy, no preparation was made to resist the insects until they had quietly penetrated practically every field.
