FIND CHROME IRON ON CANYON MOUNTAIN

LARGEST ORE BODY IN U. S. A.

San Francisco Firm Takes Over Rich Property and Starts Its Shipments.

It is said that the largest body of chrome iron in the United States is on Canyon mountain, and this week work started to put this valuable mineral on the market, says the Blue Mountain Eagle of Canyon City.

This iron will be put onto the American market by the Farnish company of San Francisco. Farnish was here last week and completed arrangements to ship the iron. He said, that he had seen nearly every body of chrome iron in the United States and that the one on Canyon mountain was the largest and the best that he had seen.

It is estimated that there is about 60,000 tons now ready for shipment. This ore as a rule does not lie in ledge matter, but rather in bunches. This seems to be a characteristic. There are numbers of other bunches of it in this vicinity, but none so large as the one that the Farnish people will handle.

The property belongs to Joe Beggs and Chas. McCorkle of this place. About a year ago they located it. The ore is all on the surface and exposed. The only work to be done is to build a road from the top of Canyon mountain so that it can be hauled out. This work started this week. And in the course of a few days teams will be on the road hauling the ore to Prairie City from which point it will be shipped. Mr. Beggs and Mr. McCorkle will be paid a royalty for every ton shipped.

This body of ore lies at the head of what is known as Quartz gulch. It is on the south side of the mountain and on the south side of the contract which carries gold value. On the chrome iron side there are no free gold values. The contract is well defined. On the chrome iron side the ore is base. As base ore it carried gold values and mining experts say, that it is the largest body of gold base ore in the United States. It extends all through the Strawberry range of mountains. On Canyon mountain there is a complete change of formation on the one side being the great bodies of base ore and on the other the free gold bodies and pocket values which fed the wonderful placers at the foot of the mountain upon which the big dredge on Canyon creek to day is feeding.
