Gold Bonds, of Series No. 1, Issue No. 1, of the denomination of One Thousand Dollars each, numbered consecutively 1 to 750 inclusive, dated January 1st, 1917, bearing Six Per Cent Interest, payable semi-annually on the 1st day of January and July of each year, principal and interest payable at the fiscal agency of the State of Oregon, in New York City, N. The purpose for which these bonds are authorized and to which the proceeds thereof will be applied is to unify and increase the capacity of the irrigation systems embraced in the district by constructing a reservoir to hold the flood waters of Malheur river and improve its various canals so as to serve 18,000 acres in addition to the 12,000 acres now cultivated.
