AGRICULTURAL COUNCIL PLANS BURY YEAR FOR 1917

For the purpose of planning a program of activities for 1917, the members of the County Agricultural Council met at the City Hall in Ontario Tuesday. This, W. W. Howard does, very important, for without a plan to work by, and without the organized backing of the farmers, little work of real value can be accomplished.

Eight projects were adopted, which the Council believes includes work of most pressing weight at present. These do not include the emergency work which must necessarily take much time, but they are projects that point toward future development of the county and do not stop with the end of the year.

Crop Demonstration Plans
The first measure adopted was the crop demonstration project. Crops will be grown to show their true value as compared with the value of other crops. Other tests will be made of varieties, and the effect of good seed. The dry farmers are especially in need of demonstrations for many of them have had no previous experience, and

the industry is a new one here, and so far has its individual peculiarities.

The corn contest has again been put on the list. It is hoped to get the Grange to go back to work in the same manner planned for this year, and to put it through. The farmers will be asked to make up the prize money among themselves. This show is very important, for even this year, which was considered a very poor corn year, yields in this county were far better than the average for the corn belt. The East has had the same trouble as Malheur county, except that in large areas their trouble was worse. A campaign for more silos will also be put on with the corn proposition. The feeding value of silage has been amply demonstrated as can be seen by the fact that several sheep men have again purchased silage after trying it last year.

Other projects that were adopted were Rabbit and Squirrel Control, farm management, accounts, county and community fairs, and organization work. The last named will be broad in its scope taking in possibly the organizing of loan associations, the testing of cows, by the granges, and other work of merit that presents itself.
