**BLOOD FROM DERELICTS.**

**Down-and-outers Form Transfusion Auxiliaries For Baltimoreans.**  
Baltimore.—More than a hundred derelicts from the Friendly Inn here have undergone blood tests at St. Agnes Hospital, a branch of Johns Hopkins University, a branch of Johns Hopkins University, for transfusion cases. Of the hundred twenty-five have been accepted and have been paid \$25 for submitting to transfusions.

In addition to the \$25, those who are accepted are being paid at the rate of \$1 a day to keep themselves in condition until they are needed. The plan was evolved by a number of the leading surgeons of the city, assisted by the agents of the Federal charities.

A history of the families of the men whose blood is used is studied, and only those of good blood are accepted. The blood of these men from the Friendly Inn now courses through the veins of a number of prominent men and women of Baltimore.

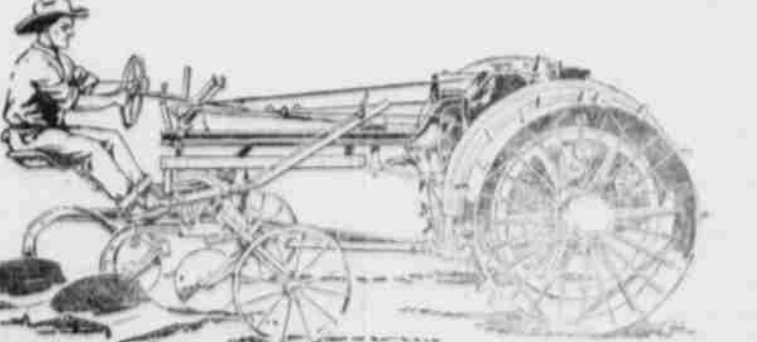
