### GRANT DEALERS WILL SHOW STUNTS

Though spectacular performances intended to demonstrate the endurance of the car have never been encouraged by the factory, Grant Six dealers in many parts of the country seem to have an irresistible impulse to put the car to supreme tests, according to George S. Waite, General Sales Manager of the Grant Motor Car Corporation, Cleveland.

"Practically every week one or two dealers send in reports and pictures of stunts they have pulled off," says Mr. Waite, "and occasionally we give publicity to a performance like backing 9 1/2 miles up Mt. Wilson or a non-stop run through seven states in high gear. But now and then an enthusiastic dealer pulls off something that makes us gasp when we hear of it at the factory."

"The latest stunt of this kind was done by our Pasadena, California, dealer who took a Grant Six through eight miles of Big Tejonja Canyon over a mule trail where nobody has ever believed that anything but a pack mule could go. In fact there is no road or trail and no attempt to make one has been made because it would be carried away by the first high water in the fall."

"Such performances simply prove what a car will stand. From this viewpoint they doubtless have considerable selling value. But they can easily be overdone. The average man does not want to put his Grant Six to any such extreme tests. He is vastly more interested in everyday reliability and economy. He'd much rather know that he can run 1000 miles without stopping his engine or changing gears."

"Buying a motor car is, with most people, more of a business proposition than a romantic adventure. At least that's the way the Grant company feels about it.
