Superintendent E. G. Bailey Asks Executive Permission to Raise Troops for Foreign Service.

Superintendent E. G. Bailey of the Ontario Public schools has written to ex-President Roosevelt asking him for permission to raise a company for the division which the Colonel is seeking authority to raise for duty in France.

Superintendent Bailey believes that there is no part of the west more capable of raising the kind of soldiers that the Colonel will need than right about Ontario and in the interior of Central Oregon. The men of this section, due to their out-of-door life can be prepared for active service in short order and are of the type that Teddy had in his Rough-Rider regiment in the Spanish-American war.

Mr. Bailey is not certain whether his effort will be made effective and is anxiously awaiting affirmative action by Congress giving Colonel Roosevelt the necessary permission. If a company is raised in his section it will probably be a cavalry company and an effort will be made to have it mounted on horses from this region.
