## BROGAN RANCHER DIES AFTER LINGERING ILLNESS

W. H. Young, aged 55 years, died at the hospital last week following an operation. Mr. Young was found in his ranch house nine miles above Brogan two weeks ago suffering terribly. Friends rushed him to Brogan and thence to Ontario and here he underwent an operation for peritonitis. Having been living alone it is not known how long he suffered before he was found but his strength was so wasted by the pain that he could not withstand the shock of the operation which was performed in hope of saving his life. His brother from Republican county Kansas arrived here last Friday and took charge of the body. Funeral services were conducted at the Ontario cemetery where interment was made by Rev. Earl M. Hanna of the Methodist church.
