NOTICE OF BOND ELECTION OF PAYETTE-OREGON SLOPE IRRIGATION DISTRICT.

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held by the electors of Payette-Oregon Slope Irrigation District on the ninth day of July, 1917, to determine whether or not bonds

of said district shall be issued as follows:

Twenty year, six per cent, bonds in the sum and amount of \$190,000.00 to refund, cancel all outstanding bonds of said district as well as all coupons on bonds and all interest issued for the payment of bonds, said refunding bonds to bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum interest payable the day of January and July of each year, the bonds maturing after the fifth year in annual installments so as to be approximately principal and interest.
