161st Inf., Sept. 15, 1917. I am now in Camp Lewis and have been here for more than a week, and thought I would write and tell you a few of my thoughts, and about things here. I cannot tell you all, though, for I is against the rules, and, hesides, it is too big.

Uncle Sam is doing a big piece of work here. Think of building a city to hold \$4000 people in three months! Of course the buildings are not fancy but they are built to last for years if necessary, and on practical lines. Row after row of barracks; miles and mile of them. Germany has probably loked already and hence the peace talk.

At present there appears to be as many officers as men here, and they are not alone good officers, but real gentlemen. They have come from the class of men that are to com-
