the Ancient Romans. In view of the varied and scientific signal methods used in modern warfare a description of the ancient signaling methods found in the writings of Polybius will prove of interest.

This writer had observed the opera-

tions of the Roman generals before the fall of Carthage in 146 B. C. and says they provided their signal stations with earthofware vessels, exactly equal in all respects and fitted with cocks which allowed the water to escape at the same rate. They were enrefully testad to make sure of the last require ment.
