

# LAWYERS TO ASSIST WITH QUESTIONNAIRES

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county board will be, whenever practicable, the county judge or a judge of the circuit court.

These legal advisory boards will be held responsible for seeing that a competent force of lawyers, or qualified laymen, is at all times available for consultation by all registrants desiring their services, during the period when the Questionnaires are to be answered.

Not only that, but the legal advisory boards will delegate these duties to lawyers in the smaller towns and villages, so that wherever a registered man may be, he will have available a competent legal advisor to help him make out his Questionnaire.

So far as the lawyers are concerned, it will all be a labor of patriotism on their part. Not a cent will they charge any registrant for their services.

"It should be the pride of every lawyer," says a statement by the War Department, "that no registrant is required to submit in the process of the selection of citizens of this Nation for duty in the present emergency."

The prompt filling out and return of Questionnaires to local exemption boards by the registrants is of the greatest importance. On the information obtained through the Questionnaires will be based the new system of classification on which selection of men for military service under the draft hereafter will be made.

tion, sell in quantity to the starch factories or canneries, or use them for stock feed. Do not mix them with the better quality and demoralize the whole potato crop, approximately 4,000 cars, it is estimated, must be shipped to outside markets, and in order to find a ready sale and good price, the potatoes must be of good quality. Let every grower bear this in mind and hold himself responsible for the proper grading of his product before shipment.

### Rise More Hogs

Through its influence on the purchase of pork for exportation the United States Food Administration will endeavor to make equitable the price of hogs in this country to keep pace with the demand for meat is

urged by Food Administrator Herbert Hoover, who says that through his influence on exports he will do all in his power to see that prices paid producers for their hogs are maintained at a ratio to feed prices that will not only cover costs of production but will properly remunerate the producer.

**One Loaf of Sugar to Our Seven!**  
Those of us who grumble at being asked not to waste sugar and other foods should be ashamed of ourselves.

The people in France today are living on one pound of sugar per month. We use seven! Seven times as much sugar as the French with all their other sacrifices, and yet we grumble!

The man who pours sugar in his coffee regardless, and then leaves half of it on the bottom of the cup doesn't like to be asked to stir it up!

Let us save part of our sugar, let us observe the wheatless days and the meatless days.

It will do us good and it will save the life of France!

It is not the intention of the Food Administration to fix prices for which farmers shall sell their stock. Through the direction of expert purchasers of beef and pork products, however, it will use its influence to stabilize meat prices and to support remunerative prices to the farmer.
