Chicago. - Sixty-two persons are known to be dead and 115 injured as a result of the rear end collision of a circus train and a string of empty Pullmans at Ivanhue, near Gary, Ind. The wrock caused by the collision caught fire and many of the deaths

resulted from the flames. The disastar occurred just at break of dawn. The victims of the disaster were mostly connected in various capacities with the Hazenbach-Wallace show which was traveling in two sections of a Michigan Central train going from Michigan City to Hammond.
