England Pretty Country, Says Ontarian's Brother in Letter.

The impressions of an American Doughboy in Merrie England is a fitting caption for the letter which Ivan Muscheltz, who lives on the St. Paul tracts west of town, received from his brother Gene, who is now "over there."

The young man's picture of the British isle presents a nidea of what most of the boys are experiencing while training in the land of Shakespeare, Browning and sages of the Anglo-Saxon race. This is how England and Ireland impressed Soldier Mushlets.

With the Colors, July 7, 1918.—Dear Brother: Have crossed the pond at last, and I think that I am going to like it fine. This is a beautiful place. But many years behind in civilization. About like our country was shortly after the Revolutionary war.

Had a splendid crossing, quiet seas except for a period of 36 hours. During that time we had some rough seas. Great walls of waves would come up and it seemed as if the ship would go completely under. But she rode the waves fine and dandy, and best of all I was not seasick. We sighted no subs at all, so can't say any thing exciting about that.

England is certainly an interesting country. It seems as if entire cities are made of buildings of the same design and size, probably apartment houses. These are made of brick and of the bungalow type. One sees no wooden structures. The country itself is very beautiful. One green valley after another appears, bordering which is usually a hedge or stone wall. Ireland is also very pretty. It

seems to be one great big dairy farm, broken up with numerous small pastures. These pastures are all fenced with stone walls or hedges. The houses are very poor, in comparison with the country. They are mostly run-down stone huts, and don't look as clean as they might be. Ruins of old towers and castles, built in the 11th century are found all along the line, which brings one back to the time of the feudal system in Europe.

I was disappointed in Liverpool, in so much that it seemed so far behind the U. S. in modern conveniences and structures. Dublin, tho, is a prettier city than I imagined, and Cork is a real city.

You should see the trains in this country. They are little tiny things, and the coaches are small, and divided into private compartments; but they can sure travel altho they go almost as far up and down and sideways as forward.

As for this camp it is a regular home, good feed and lots of it. The officers all seem to be such nice fellows that even the most lazy one is willing to work.

We had a splendid feed July 4. It made me feel as if I were eating a Christmas dinner at home. Things look here as if the Germans can't last much longer. I don't see how they can.

Would sure like to hear from home. Have not heard a word since May 25, and I received that in Philadelphia forwarded from San Diego. Am sure glad that I am over here. Well, Ivan, good luck and lots of it. I am in a good place here, so don't worry. BROTHER GENE.

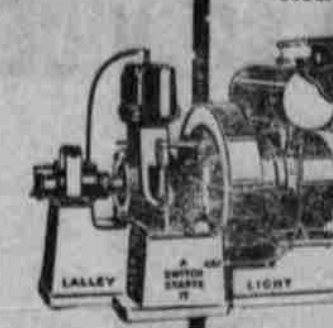
