**WANTED, MORE MODERN HOUSES IN ONTARIO**

Many Citizens Seek Residences in Vain—Consider Possibility of Having Building & Loan Association Started.

"If Ontario had twenty-five new modern homes right now they would be occupied," declared a business man on the street the other day.

"I know a man who came here to live two weeks ago. He found employment in one of the local barber-shops and said he liked the town. His wife followed him here from Nampa and after searching in vain for a suitable place in which to live, they left this week for Nampa," was the story told the Argus by another business man.

Hardly a day and never a week goes by that the Argus is not called upon by some one for information concerning houses for rent, or furnished rooms to be had.

All this shows the demand for space in which to live in this city. There is plenty of space in open sage brush lots, and many of the lots are a burden to their owners when they might be revenue producers.

There has been some talk of the formation of a building and loan association, but no action has been taken toward the consummation of that desirable adjunct to the city.

At least two new residents of the city have within the past week spent days endeavoring to locate dwellings without success. When all of Ontario's soldiers boys get "back home" the condition is bound to be worse. Nothing could improve Ontario more, or contribute to the needed business revival all over the country than an epidemic of home building. All the officials of the government from the President Wilson down who this week have attended the Governors' and Mayors' conference in Washington urged municipal construction of all kinds, to help get the unemployed in jobs. Ontario can do more patriotic service then by starting a building campaign. Who will be first?

**LEGISLATURE GIVES DEVELOPMENT BOOST**

000 bushels of wheat and in 1917 when it did not rain much they shipped out only 66,000 bushels. Forgiving all its sins of omission and commission here is one act western and eastern Oregon can agree on for draining wet land and irrigating dry land and all vote for it on June 3.

Another reconstruction measure is the Eddy Farm Settlement bill which will be more benefit, perhaps to the farms of the western part of the state than to the rich lands of eastern Oregon, but which on the whole is a good bill and will be of lasting benefit to the whole state in the same development of the agricultural resources of the state at large.

House Bill 243 by Mr. Gallagher is an important measure so far as the interests of the state are concerned, as it permits and authorizes the State land to proceed with the classification of its lands, and further authorizes the board to settle pending suits, to procure lands adjacent to lands now owned, or which it may recover in the fraud suits, and to settle reclaim or colonize the lands. This is of material benefit to Harney County where the State has brought suits to recover large tracts of land from the Pacific Live Stock company.

Another bill is to be submitted to the people asking for an appropriation of five million dollars, part of which is to be used in the settlement of lands, and a part set aside to match like amounts from the Federal Government in accordance with the Lane bill, or the Sinnott bill, for the reclamation of arid lands.

It is generally conceded that the state which is ready to co-operate with the Federal Government in reclamation projects will be the one to receive recognition, and to this end the legislature is submitting the last named bill to the people for their approval.

Take it all and all, the legislature has passed and is submitting some real reconstruction measures, all of which will be of direct benefit to eastern Oregon.

There is a strong sentiment both in Portland and in the Willamette Valley for the Gallagher amendment, guaranteeing the payment of the interest on irrigation and drainage securities, and should this amendment be adopted, it will mean millions of dollars to the farmers and ranchmen of the state who are now
