CLEAN UP YOUR PREMISES

All citizens of Ontario are requested to clean up the premises owned or occupied by them between April 6th and April 15th, 1919, and to destroy by fire all rubbish it is possible to burn and to remove beyond the City limits all rubbish of an inflammable nature. All earth-culverts and outside toilets must be disinfected, at least once every week, with Chloride of Lime. All stables, barns, corrals, poultry sheds or pens, in use must be cleaned up every week and all buildings and premises must be kept free from an accumulation of dirt or trash of any kind. No fires for burning of rubbish allowed after six o'clock p. m.

Warning

The City Police will from time to time inspect all business buildings, residences, stables and out-buildings within the City limits and complaints will be made against the person or persons permitting unsanitary conditions to exist in or about these premises.

Remember!

That the depositing of filth or rubbish in streets or alleys is not cleaning up and is forbidden.

It is to be hoped that all citizens will make a vigorous and united effort from civic pride or a care for their personal welfare to clean up their premises and then keep them clean and that there may be no occasion to enforce the provisions of Ordinance No. 177.
