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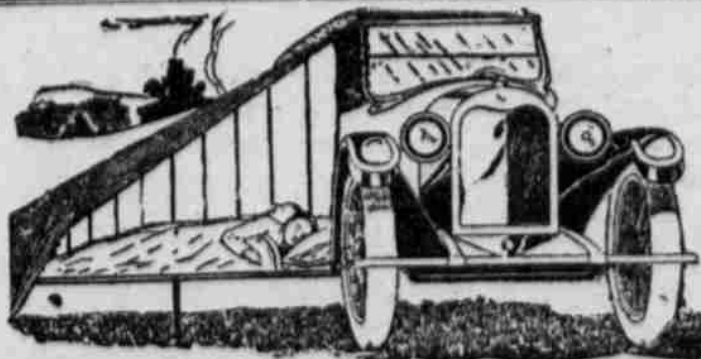

"I want every church in Oregon to feel that it is its patriotic duty not only to get behind Employment Sunday May 4, but to mobilize its members so that every available job will be listed with the United States branch agencies, the only cost free, unbiased, partisan agency in the world", Director Smith said to Mr. Ellison.
