 value for the property.
 E. A. Fraser who was called upon declared that he did not favor such a transaction which would set a precedent and result in the disfigurement of the city, reducing, too, the width of Washington street on which there is a great deal of travel to the freight station. Nick Kreis also voiced his objections declaring he owned four corners in the city and they were for sale and that there was no need for the city selling street property.
 Judge W. W. Wood who represented Mr. Robinson called attention to the fact that the city only proposed to pave its streets to a width of 52 feet and that if the 16 feet were sold, and ten taken off the other side there still would be more street room than that used in cities many times larger than Ontario.
 T. H. Moore declared that, tho by losing Mr. Richardson as a tenant, if the city sold the property in view of the fact it was to be used for the erection of a good business block, he would favor the sale.
 The Council ordered the construction of a ten foot cement walk along the south side of Nevada avenue from Oregon street to Virtue street, and also on the North side of Idaho avenue near Richardson.
