Both these words meant originally almost exactly the reverse of their present definitions, "Pretty" comes from the old French word proud or "prud." In old Saxon the became "prut"-magnificent, word splendid, vain insolent. From this came "prit" or "pritte," meaning almost the same; till at length it came to signify handsome, bold or fine; finally, after many gradutions, reaching its present usual sense as a personal adjective of girlish and effend-oate significance. "Nice"—which comes from a French source-at first meant foolish, absurd, ridiculous; then in course of time it came to signify wanton, whimsical, fantastic; then delicate and subtle, till finally it was used to denote any specially pleasant quality.
