NOTICE OF THE INTENTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ONTARIO, OREGON, TO IMPROVE THE FOLLOWING STREETS AND AVENUES, TO-WIT:

All that portion of Oregon Street beginning at the property line at the south corner of Block 17, thence northward to the property line on the north side of the intersection of said Oregon Street with Illinois Avenue; and all that portion of Richardson Street between Nevada and Washington Avenues, together with the intersection of said Street;

All that portion of Nevada Avenue beginning at the Depot and extending westward to the intersection with Richardson Street; Washington Avenue from Oregon Short Line track to Richardson Street;

All that portion of Idaho Avenue beginning at the eastern City limit and thence west to the intersection of said Idaho Avenue with Oregon Street;

All that portion of Colorado Avenue beginning at the east line of the Oregon Short Line Company's right of way, thence westward to the intersection of said Colorado Avenue with Oregon Street;

All that portion of Illinois Avenue, beginning with its intersection with Oregon Street, thence west to Wasco Street, including the intersection thereon;

All that portion of California Avenue, beginning at the intersection of said California Avenue with the Oregon Short Line Railroad track, thence westward to Maple Street at the Hospital, and assess the cost thereof upon the property adjacent thereto and especially benefited thereby;

Pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 324, passed, approved and effective on the 16th day of June, A. D. 1919, notice is hereby given to all property owners effected thereby that the City Council of the City of Ontario, intends to improve all of the following streets and avenues in said City according to the provisions of said Ordinance, reference to which is hereby made for greater certainty, and to assess the cost of said improvements upon the property adjacent thereto, and especially benefited thereby, except the cost of all street and alley intersections, which shall be paid by the said City.

It is the Council's intention to improve all of the following streets and avenues, as follows, to-wit:

All that portion of Oregon Street beginning at the property line at the south corner of block 17, thence northward to the property line on the north side of the intersection of said Oregon Street with Illinois Avenue; and all that portion of Richardson Street between Nevada and Washington Avenues, together with the intersection of said Street;

All that portion of Nevada Avenue beginning at the Depot and extending westward to the intersection with Richardson Street; Washington Avenue from Oregon Short Line track to Richardson Street.

All that portion of Idaho Avenue beginning at the eastern City limit and thence west to the intersection of said Idaho Avenue with Oregon Street;

All that portion of Colorado Avenue, beginning at the east line of the Oregon Short Line Company's right of way, thence westward to the intersection of said Colorado Avenue with Oregon Street;

All that portion of Illinois Avenue beginning with its intersection with Oregon Street, thence west to Wasco Street, including the intersection thereon;

All that portion of California Avenue beginning at the Oregon Short Line Railroad track, thence westward to Maple Street at the Hospital, by paving the roadway of said street with hard surface pavement for the width of 52 feet between the curbs on Oregon Street, and that the hard surface pavement from California Avenue from Maple Street to its intersection with Richardson Street, be of a width of twenty feet, and that the hard surface pavement on Idaho Avenue from the city limits of the east rail of the Oregon Short Line Railroad be twenty feet, and all that portion of Illinois Avenue to be twenty feet wide, and that all of the other pavements herein called for be of a width of fifty-two feet, and by constructing concrete curbs thereon wherever necessary in accordance with the specifications outlined by the City Engineer.

You are hereby further notified that the said Council will meet at the Council Chambers in the City Hall on the 26th day of June, 1919, at the hour of eight o'clock, p. m., for the purpose of considering objections to and protests against the improvements and assessments of property to pay the cost thereof, and all property owners are adjacent to said proposed streets and avenues to be improved are hereby called upon to appear before the said Council at said time and place, and show cause if any, why said improvements should not be made and said property assessed for the cost and expense thereof.

NOTICE OF HEARING ON PETITION TO FORM DRAINAGE DISTRICT

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR THE COUNTY OF MALHEUR. Notice is hereby given that a hearing on the following petition will be held at the Court House in the city of Vale, County of Malheur, State of Oregon, on the 4th day of August 1919, at the hour of one o'clock p. m. of said day, for the purpose of determining whether the prayer of said petition shall be granted. The following is a true and correct copy of said petition, to-wit:

PETITION IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR THE COUNTY OF MALHEUR In the matter of the organization of the VALLEY VIEW DRAINAGE DISTRICT for the drainage of lands situated in Malheur County, in the State of Oregon. We, the undersigned, being owners

of lands within the proposed drainage district, and for the purpose of organizing the same, respectfully make the following statement:

The name proposed for such drainage district shall be "VALLEY VIEW DRAINAGE DISTRICT"

The boundary lines of the District shall be as follows:

Beginning at the quarter corner between Sections 28 and 29, T. 18 S., R. 47 E., W. M.; thence South along the East line of Section 29, to its intersection with the Westerly bank of the Wilson Ditch; thence Southerly along the Westerly bank of said Wilson Ditch to the South line of Section 32, T. 18 S., R. 47 E., W. M.; thence West along the South line of Sections 32 and 31 to its intersection with the Westerly bank of the "Shoestring" Irrigation Ditch; on the south line of the West 1/2 of the West 1/2 of Section 31, T. 18 S., R. 47 E., W. M.; thence in a Northerly direction along the Westerly bank of said "Shoestring" Irrigation ditch to its intersection with the East and West center line of Section 30, T. 18 S., R. 47 E., W. M.; thence East to the point of beginning.

That the total acreage included within the said boundary lines of said proposed drainage district is 1542.73 acres, more or less, and is all situated within Malheur County, State of Oregon.

That the names of the owners of the lands within the proposed boundary lines of the Valley View Drainage District and the approximate acreage owned by each is as follows:

That in addition to the lands owned by the above named persons, there are public high-ways, roadways, and other right-of-ways, situated within the proposed boundary lines, consisting of county roads, telephone line of the Malheur Home Telephone Company, power line of the Idaho Power Company, the Oregon Short Line Railway, and the Owyhee Ditch Company.

That the proposed reclamation is principally for agricultural purposes, and that said reclamation will be conducive to the public health, welfare, and of public utility and benefit.

That all of the lands included within the said boundary lines aforesaid fall within the said boundary lines of the proposed district; and all of said lands will be beneficially affected by the proposed works of the proposed district.

That the proposed drainage district plans to construct a system of drainage and waste ditches to drain the wet and water logged lands included in said district, and to provide a system for carrying the surplus and waste waters from the irrigated lands in said district. That the benefits of said proposed reclamation will exceed the damage done and the costs of such works, and the best interests of the lands included within such proposed district, as a whole, and of the public at large, will be promoted by the formation and operation of this proposed district.

That the formation of a drainage district under the provisions of Chapter 349, Laws of Oregon, 1915, and the laws amendatory thereof, is a proper and advantageous method of accomplishing the reclamation and protection of the lands included therein.

That a brief, general, informal statement of the proposed plan of reclamation is as follows: The plan of reclamation tentatively proposed is a covered tile drain with an outlet into the slough east of the Valley View Schoolhouse, this drain following the road along the township line with branches to tap and drain all of the alkali or waterlogged areas in Sections 30, 31 and 32. Also a covered tile drain, with outlet into the slough in the Northeast quarter of the Northeast quarter (NE 1/4 NE 1/4) of Section 32, and draining the alkali and waterlogged areas in Section 29. These drains to be laid at a proper depth to be hereafter determined as necessary to give thorough drainage, and to be provided with concrete manholes, catch basins, outlets and other appurtenances which may be found necessary.

The signers of this petition hereby agree that they will pay the expenses incurred and any tax or taxes that may be levied against the lands for the purpose of paying the expenses of organizing or attempting to organize the proposed district, and any engineering expenses incurred in connection with such organization or at-

tempted organization, in event that said district is not organized by order or decree of the above entitled court.

WHEREFORE your petitioners pray that this court make and enter an order and decree declaring the proposed drainage district organized; and that the lands described in said petition, or so much of them as shall be found by the court to be properly included shall be within said district as organized, until investigation and surveys are made that shall permit elimination of lands not properly included; and that said district shall be known as the "VALLEY VIEW DRAINAGE DISTRICT."
