**HERO OF EASTLAND DISASTER
TO SPEAK AT DREAMLAND**

Wearing more medals than possibly any other single individual for deeds of bravery and heroism, Arthur Loeb, the hero of the Eastland disaster, is in Ontario today and Friday evening, and will speak in the Dreamland theatre and show a reel of pictures of scenes of the great catastrophe that shocked the world on July 24, 1915.

Mr. Loeb rescued 38 lives and recovered 67 bodies from the wreck of the vessel that overturned at its pier at Chicago. The Eastland had on board 4000 people who were about to go on an excursion. Of these, more than 1400 men, women and children were drowned. Mr. Loeb claims to be the only man living with a ruptured blood vessel in his forehead and a fracture at the top of his skull, injuries received when he performed his great deed of heroism in rescuing people from the Eastland. He was unconscious after his experiences for many hours and three times was pronounced dead. He refused to die, however, and today is in perfect health despite the injuries he still carries.
