Mrs. Y. W. Tomlinson and children arrived from Portland Friday to spend a few weeks with the former's parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Landingham.

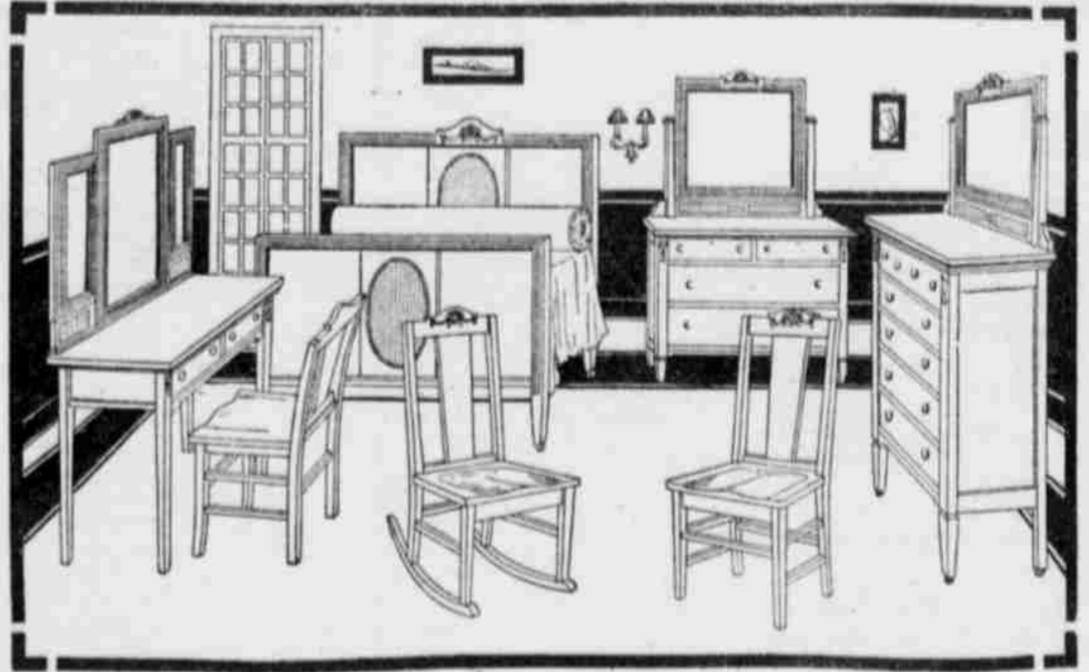

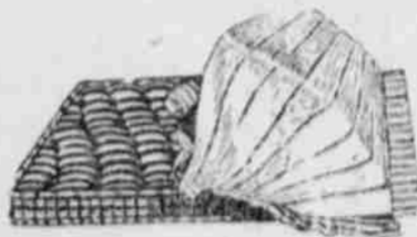

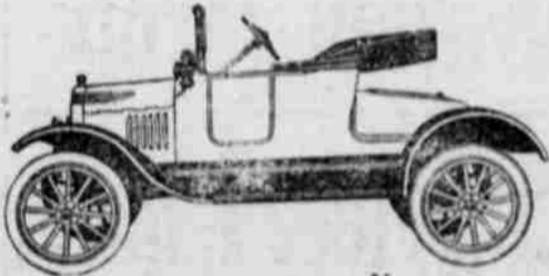
