A delegation of business men, headed by A. L. Cockrum and Ed Fraser, visited Jamieson and Brogan last Sunday in the interest of the Fair and were successful in interesting the fruit growers in that district in lining up community displays and live stock. They were assured of earnest support by the fruit growers in that district, and from appearances a good variety and large displays of fruits will be shown.

The Tru-Blu Biscuit company of Spokane, has offered as special premiums 1 \$3.00 package of Krause's Cloriana Chocolates and 1 \$1.00 tin Tru-Blu sodas. These will be awarded to the women's departments.

We can definitely announce that, barring accidents to the pilot or machine, a flyer will be in attendance at the Fair. A contract has been completed between the Fair Board and the Idaho Aeroplane Motor company, and a cash bond put up by them assuring the Fair patrons of exhibition flights. Warren Bruce, the pilot, spent eighteen months overseas with the 28th Aero Pursuit Squadron and fifteen months in actual war flying. He is an American Ace and has four Hun planes to his credit. Warren Bruce tells us he will "pull off" every stunt known in the flying game and will also take up passengers at a normal charge.

The Payette Creamery company, in conjunction with the DeLaval Separator company, have reserved space at the grounds for a big exhibit of dairy and farm machinery.

President H. H. Tunny has again been very active, during the past week, in lining up stock exhibits. Elton Webb of Fruitland, well known throughout the district for his thoroughbred cattle, has arranged to have a number of pure bred short horns on display.

In explanation of departments K, L, M, N, O, and R of the premium list: Whilst the different kinds were not enumerated, two prizes will be offered for each variety in each class; for example: Class 230—Canned fruit. A first and second prize will be offered for each kind of canned fruit, whether apples, pears, plums, prunes, peaches, cherries, apricots or berries. The same applies to Department R, Class 308. If a number of

different cut flowers were mentioned it is very possible the pet variety you had fostered during the season, intent upon capturing the prize, would have been omitted. Therefore, no particular flower was listed, but all kinds will be judged in their respective classes. There will be two prizes offered for the best one vase exhibit of roses, dahlias, asters, etc. If this isn't clear, you have only to make inquiry from the Secretary, and if a class has not been provided for the article you have prepared, no matter in what department, we want your exhibit and a premium will be arranged. It is only by having the hearty support of the entire community that this Fair can be made "The Best Yet," and from indications, which are most encouraging, it will surpass any Fair held previously.

The date of the Fair is drawing very close, and in order to give the proper air of festivity, it is essential that each business house and residence be suitably decorated with the Fair colors; namely: blue and white. Don't forget to order your bunting early, and have a good supply of flags.

Ontario is going to be taxed to its utmost capacity in providing accommodations for our Fair visitors, and in order that there may be no hitch at the last moment, kindly list with the Secretary, without delay, the number of rooms you will have vacant for Fair week.

### ONLY BOILING POINT TEST CAN TELL TRUE VALUE OF GASOLINE

The old gravity test for gasoline really tells nothing of its efficiency because gasoline of the same gravity may differ greatly in boiling points, and boiling points are the only true measure of gasoline value. By mixing two gasolines of high gravity and low gravity, a combination can be obtained which will meet whatever gravity test is desired, but such fuel would not work efficiently in an automobile engine.

When, however, the boiling point test is used, the refined can be sure of maintaining the quality of his product and the motorist can be sure of a uniform gasoline. Every gasoline, for good service, must possess a gradually rising series of boiling points. Low boiling points are absolutely essential for starting but are useless for high power. High boiling points give power, but no motor would start if only the high boiling points were used. The full chain of boiling points must be presented.

Only straight distilled gasoline has the necessary boiling points. Red Crown is a well-known gasoline which possesses the full and continuous chain necessary for easy starting and full power.
