State Board of Horticulture do here-

the introduction of the alfalfa weevil
into Oregon it is necessary to prohibit
the importation into the State of Ore-

ming and Idaho of all kinds of hay
and straw, including hay, straw,
grass, forage plants, weeds or tule
used in cattle cars or used for pack-
ing nursery stock of any kind, or in
connection with hives of bees, or in
any other way, and hereafter and un-
till further notice such importations
from the states of Utah, Wyoming
and Idaho is prohibited.
