COMMUNITY EXHIBITS

SHAPING UP
 Reports coming from various communities in the County are to the effect that there will be a great deal of good natured rivalry in the community exhibits this year. All of the progressive communities in the County are coming through with a fine collection of exhibits.

This feature of the show is very attractive and of much value to the various communities of the County, particularly at this time when there are so many strangers in the County seeking to buy homes, and who will naturally be attracted to the community that puts on a good exhibit at the Fair.

Then, too, an exhibit will be sent from this Fair to the State Fair where it will be shown and the Oregon State Chamber of Commerce will then take it and place it on exhibition in the Oregon Building in Portland, where it will be witnessed by a great many thousand people every year.

It is very urgent that we have a good exhibit this year to go to the State Fair, because there are so many people naturally coming to Eastern Oregon attracted by the development work being done on the Wapinitia Irrigation project, that it will be of great advantage if we could have this added advertisement in the State Exhibit building in Portland.

Livestock Exhibit Encouraged.
 Stockmen who exhibit at the Malheur County Fair this year will be pleased to note that everything possible is being done to make the Fair grounds attractive and convenient. The cattle barns have all been renovated and the inside will be whitewashed, thus showing the cattle up to much greater advantage. Additional watering troughs will be put in at convenient places.

The directors are now working on the plan of building a small show ring with elevated seats, so that the

parties desiring to witness the showing of the fine stock and hear the Judges' statements regarding the prize winners, will have no difficulty in doing so. This will also attract many more people to the judging.

The Corn Products and Refining company of New York has reserved a place in the Exhibition Hall to display by-products of corn.

A party of live wires, headed by Al. Chance and Frank Rader, visited Nyassa and the Big Bend country by auto Tuesday, and lined up quite a number of single farm exhibits.

The Fair Board decided to have the Exhibit Hall whitewashed from top to bottom, which will not only give a cleaner appearance, but will aid in giving more and better light.

President Tunny advises that, during the past week, he was successful in lining up quite a number of cattle and grain exhibits. Among the exhibitors being N. S. Felthouse of New Plymouth. Mr. Felthouse has exhibited at the County Fairs before and has always captured quite a number of prizes, and this year he has promised to show registered Short-horn cattle, Hampshire sheep and Standard bred horses.

We are advised by G. W. Dean, Master of the Grange, that a committee of farmers in the Boulevard district has been appointed to gather a community display. Mr. Dean also tells us that his neighbors expect to clean up the prizes at the County Fair. We are glad to hear this good news, but from reports received from other districts, there is going to be lots of competition, and it will not be known until after the judging has taken place which is the best community. We are expecting big things from the Boulevard this year and know the farmers will keep up their end.

Tells About Resolution.

"At first there was a disposition not to endorse any irrigation project," said Mr. Blackaby, "and an effort was made to side track the resolution to the irrigation committee. Those opposed endorsement took the position that the state chamber should consider all of the feasible projects and endorse them in a body and leave the selection to the federal authorities, where of course, it will ultimately rest.

"I opposed this plan and urged that definite projects be selected so that the federal authorities would know what we want. In this I was supported by C. C. Chapman of the Oregon Voter, Emory Olmstead and other Portland men, and thru their co-operation the resolution was finally adopted.

"The work done for the Owyhee, since it is the first project endorsed, should be of material benefit, and it shows, too, that the people over there are interested in the development of irrigation projects on this side of the mountains."

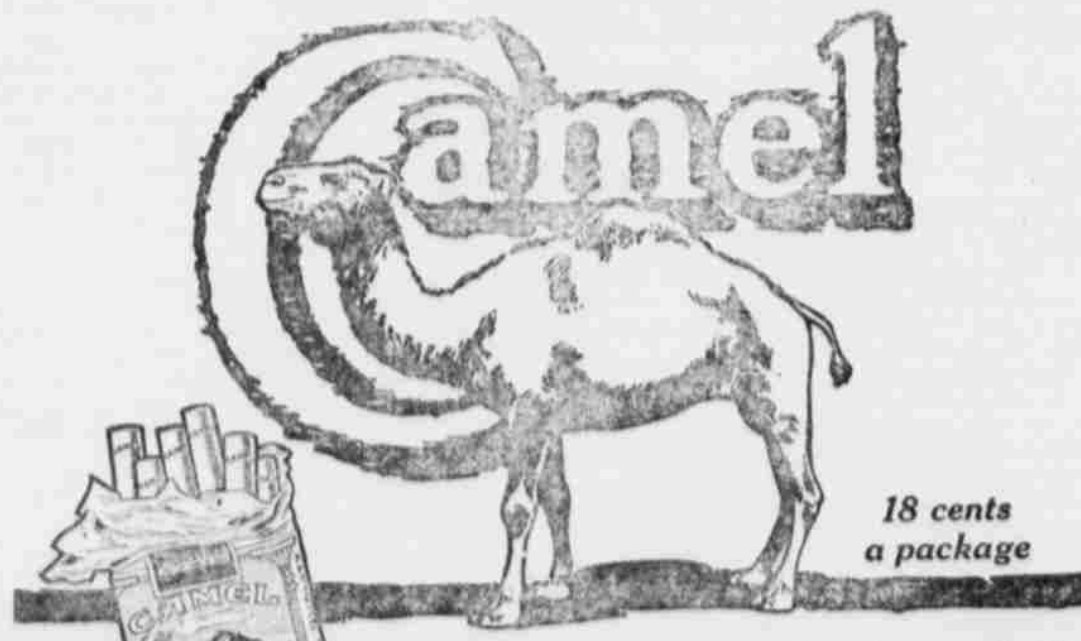
