

After the armistice was signed he was located at Coblenz, Germany, and had an opportunity to see the fa-mous scenes on the Rhine, for he was assigned to duty on an excursion boat that ran up and down that fa-

mous river.
"The Germans apparently did not consider themselves beaten in bat-tle," was one of his observations. "I talked to many of them who de-ciared that they quit because they ran out of food and raw materials, and thus they ascribed their defeat to the blockade which the fleets

maintained."

After his discharge from the service he started west and visited for a few days in Nebraska.
