DIRECTOR CENTER RESIGNS

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Sept. 15.—Announcement of the resignation of O. D. Center, for the last two years director of extension service at the college, has been made. He will have charge of extension work in McLean county, Ill., at an increased salary. His resignation will become effective between October 15 and November 1. McLean county has a larger budget for extension work than the whole state of Oregon from state sources. Director Center, as director of extension work and president of the Oregon Dairy council, has done effective work in building up the agricultural industry of the state. Work of the extension service has grown materially.
